

OFFICIAL COUNTY COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS

MARCH 2, 2021

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session in the Lovatt Room of the Sublette County Library on this date with Joel Bousman, Tom Noble, Doug Vickrey, Sam White, Dave Stephens, Clayton Melinkovich, Matt Gaffney (Zoom), Brady Oltmans representing the Pinedale Roundup, and Carrie Long, County Clerk, present.

Chairman Bousman led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

It was moved by Commissioner White, seconded by Commissioner Noble to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried.

The minutes from the preceding meeting on February 16 were approved and ordered filed on motion by Commissioner Stephens, seconded by Commissioner Vickrey. Motion carried.

Billy Pape, Road & Bridge Superintendent, updated the Board on activities, mostly snow removal.

Eric Sackett, Rio Verde Engineering, presented bids for the Horse Creek Box Culvert Project. The Engineer's estimate was \$360,344.00. The bid from Teletractors, Inc. was \$445,031.00 and the bid from A & T Welding, Inc. was \$574,119.91. Chairman Bousman requested the project be rebid.

Sackett also discussed options regarding the narrow section of East River Road (CR 23-110). Sackett and Pape were instructed to stay within the current right of way while making improvements to the road.

Laila Illoway, County Assessor, met with the Board to review the estimated decrease of approximately 50% in estimated Assessed Value of oil & gas. Chairman Bousman stated the Board should send out a message to elected officials and department heads requesting input regarding personnel and future budgets.

Dave Doorn, Rural Health Care District, updated the Board on the status of USDA application and Hospital District plans.

Clayton Melinkovich, Deputy County Attorney, updated the Board on the status of the Van Guard lawsuit.

It was moved by Commissioner Noble, seconded by Commissioner White to approve a contract with Rocky Mountain Power regarding the Big Piney Library remodel with the option for credit for installation service. Motion carried.

Todd Hurd, Forsgren Associates, updated the Board on current projects.

Shad Cooper, Fire Warden, met with the Board via Zoom. He recommended the Board accept the proposal from Union for dedicated internet access at the Sheriff offices in Marbleton and Pinedale for \$300 per month. The recommendation was approved on motion from Commissioner Noble, seconded by Commissioner White.

It was moved by Commissioner Noble, seconded by Commissioner White to sell the 1997 Ford F350 brush truck for \$17,750.00. Motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Noble, seconded by Commissioner White to sell the 1962 Dodge Power waged for \$6000.00. Motion carried.

Commissioner White made a motion to accept the bid of \$352,408 for a Type 3 Wildland Fire truck, Commissioner Noble seconded the motion. Motion carried 3 to 2 with Commissioner Vickrey and Commissioner Stephens voting nay.

Cooper requested approval to seek grant funding to update the Community Wildfire Protection Plan. He stated the plan needs to be updated every 5 years. It was moved by Commissioner White, seconded by Commissioner Stephens to approve the request, up to \$100,000, to pay for the CWPP. Motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Noble, seconded by Commissioner White to approve an application from Daniel Community Center, Inc and Union Wireless requesting a Conditional Use Permit for the construction of a 50 ft. Broad Band Communication Tower to be located at 18 School House Lane in Daniel, WY. Motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner White, seconded by Commissioner Noble to approve the applications from Monument Ridge Ranch, LLC requesting to create a two lot Minor Subdivision from a 35-acre tract, and the subsequent Change of Zoning District Boundary for the (A-1) Agricultural Zoning, to (RR-10) Rural Residential 10 Acre Zoning for the newly created lots. Motion carried.

Payroll in the amount of \$1,032,775.98 was approved on motion by Commissioner White, seconded by Commissioner Stephens.

It was moved by Commissioner Vickrey, seconded by Commissioner Noble to approve accounts payable. Motion carried.
