

**OFFICIAL COUNTY COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS**  
**AUGUST 24, 2010**

The Board of County Commissioners met in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Sublette County Courthouse on this date at 9:00 a.m. with Bill Cramer, John Linn, Joel Bousman, Megan Rawlins of the Pinedale Roundup, Mari Muzzi of the Sublette Examiner, and Mary Lankford, County Clerk present.

Chairman Cramer led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

The official bond for Becky Thompson, Treasurer for the Museum Board, in the amount of \$1,500 was approved and ordered filed with the County Treasurer.

Four bids were reviewed for the purchase of a 2010 motor grader. It was moved by Commissioner Linn and seconded by Commissioner Bousman to accept the bid from Honnen Equipment for a 2010 John Deere 872GP All Wheel Drive Motor Grader in the amount of \$188,135.00 with trade. The motion carried.

Four bids were reviewed for the purchase of a 2010 loader. It was moved by Commissioner Linn and seconded by Commissioner Bousman to accept the bid from Honnen Equipment for a 2010 John Deere 824K Loader in the amount of \$234,726.00 with trade. The motion carried.

Butch Penton, Road & Bridge Superintendent, reported on the Jack Creek bridge, Mickelson Lane project, North Piney project, Ehman Lane seeding, East Green River Road dug way, Dry Piney project, the hole in the Fish Hatchery Road, Muddy Loop near Marbleton, fencing and easement on South Piney Fish Creek road, and the fishing access at Sommers.

The Board reviewed the petition for the establishment of a portion of Meadowlark Lane and Iroquois Trail as a County Road. The field inspection report prepared by Skylar Wilson, Deputy County Surveyor, was reviewed. It has been determined that snow catchers, movement and/or marking of utility pedestals, and a turnaround will be required. Penton was directed to prepare a letter of requirements for the petitioners.

Brad Clingman, Waste Management Superintendent, and Frank Grimes, representing Nelson Engineering, reviewed the DEQ Permit application. Teton County has not signed the application. The Board reviewed a letter from Teton County concerning the operating contract and suggested meeting on October 19<sup>th</sup> to resolve the issues. The closure of Tri Town Recycling was discussed. Scott Scherbel requested that the Board allow the Tri Town Recycling Board to keep the trucks and trailers and continue to encourage recycling. The Board decided to send a letter to the other members of the Joint Powers Board to determine if they want to continue the Joint Powers Board.

It was moved by Commissioner Linn and seconded by Commissioner Bousman to adopt Resolution No. 10-100131C requesting El Paso to not pay \$15 million demanded by Western Watersheds Project as part of the Ruby Pipeline Project. The motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Linn and seconded by Chairman Cramer to appoint Commissioner Joel Bousman to the Coalition of Pipeline Counties. The motion carried.

Darrell Walker, Brad Bousman, Dan Stroud, and Sno Ann Engler, representing the Conservation District, discussed future housing for the district.

Frank James, Fairgrounds Manager, presented his letter of resignation effective October 31, 2010. The Board expressed its appreciation for James work. Gary Kanski suggested meeting with James before he leaves.

Keith Raney, County Sanitarian, discussed the EPA Memorandum of Understanding concerning Fremont Lake, which needs to be signed by January. Raney reviewed his department's activities.

It was moved by Commissioner Bousman and seconded by Commissioner Linn to renew the health insurance with IAT with an \$85,000 stop loss. The motion carried.

Al Radke discussed a letter to the Wyoming Water Development Commission.

Christine Priest, representing Groathouse Construction, discussed the following projects:

1. Ice Arena Project. It was moved by Commissioner Bousman and seconded by Commissioner Linn to approve Change Order #1 in the amount of \$28,500 for the project bond. The motion carried. Testing and inspection was discussed.
2. Daniel Schoolhouse. Asbestos was discovered and a removal plan is being developed.
3. Old Pinedale Clinic Remodel. Demolition is complete, roughing in and framing occurring. It was moved by Commissioner Bousman and seconded by Commissioner Linn to approve Change Order #1 for the amount of \$8,744.00 for replacement of deteriorated waste and water lines. The motion carried. Change Order #2 was discussed.
4. Livestock Barn and Fairgrounds. The Board approved a request from LaMere Concrete for gas line damage. The masonry walls and roof leak was discussed and will be repaired. A Contingency Item for microphones was referred to Frank James.
5. Ag Center Renovation. Demolition is completed and new color panels were discussed.
6. Food Basket. It was decided to add additional 2x10 joists to the Mezzanine Deck.
7. Marbleton Senior Center. Chambers is aware of the various leaks and will be fixing them.

Glenn Whipple and Robin Schamber, representing the University of Wyoming Extension, discussed the Sublette County Afterschool 4-H Program. The Board approved participation in a three-year program with UW.

The Board signed the Metro Law Enforcement contracts with the Towns of Big Piney and Marbleton for FY11.

The Board signed a contract for rental space with Few Investments.

It was moved by Commissioner Bousman and seconded by Commissioner Linn to approve the Homeland Security Emergency Management Performance Grant for FY10, in the amount of \$29,042.00 and the Department of Health Capacity Grant Contract in the amount of \$9,000.00. The motion carried and the agreements were signed.

It was moved by Commissioner Bousman and seconded by Commissioner Linn to adopt Resolution No. 10-100132C appointing the Sweetwater County Prosecutor's Office to determine possible criminal charges and to undertake further prosecution, if applicable of Jason Caudill. The motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Bousman and seconded by Commissioner Linn to issue a malt beverage permit to Half Moon Lake Lodge for a wedding on September 18, 2010. The motion carried.
