

**OFFICIAL COUNTY COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS**  
**APRIL 3, 2012**

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session in the Commissioners Meeting Room of the Sublette County Courthouse in Pinedale, Wyoming, on this date at 9:00 a.m. with Joel Bousman, Andy Nelson, John Linn, Sam Luvisi of the Sublette Examiner, Matt Manguso of the Pinedale Roundup, and Mary Lankford, County Clerk present.

Chairman Bousman led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

The minutes of the preceding regular meeting of March 20, 2012, were approved and ordered filed on motion by Commissioner Nelson and seconded by Commissioner Linn. The motion carried.

Butch Penton, Road and Bridge Superintendent, reported on damage repair to Favazzo County Road caused by Pinedale Natural Gas, opening roads, crack sealing, and LaBarge Creek Road.

Mark Eatinger, representing Rio Verde Engineering, reported on additional construction signs on the Calpet Road project and BLM exceptions for big game and sage grouse on the corner on Red Hill. He also reported on crushing at the Beaver Pit.

Brad Clingman, Waste Management Superintendent, reported on the hiring of new personnel, the new Pinedale Transfer Station contract, and safety training and audit.

Tony Gosar discussed glass recycling and air and water quality.

Sheriff Dave Lankford requested donated sick leave for Gene Bryson. It was moved by Commissioner Linn and seconded by Commissioner Nelson to allow the donation of a maximum of 16 hours per employee to Bryson, upon the use of his sick leave and vacation. The motion carried.
